It was an excellent public speaking opportunity in front of new audiences and one that our students enjoyed very much. We were very proud of their performance, poise and ability to keep to time which showed how polished they have become in the art of debating!

Eton College Debates

So a very close call in a fascinating debate hugely enjoyed by all participating.

Sustainability Club Wednesdays Break 2 (B2)

Sustainability Club is a fairly new club to Cox Green and one that we hope will make a positive impact on our school community alongside our wider community. We are four year 13 students with a passion for creating positive changes within our school and local community. With the help of Miss Richardson, we were able to bring to life our vision of creating a club which makes a positive change within our school and community, a club which allows you to meet new people and make new friends. We started Sustainability Club at the end of October last year with the aim of recycling crisp packets into blankets for local people in need. When ironed, the crisp packets are fused together, therefore forming the blanket. We have nearly finished our first blanket and are hoping to make more. Once completed, we will be donating the blankets to those in need.

Coming to Sustainability Club is a great way to meet like minded people, create new friends, advocate for positive change within our school and do your part for the planet.
