Bikes

Students are encouraged to cycle to school. It is expected that students ride their bicycles with care and in accordance with the Highway Code. Students should wheel their bicycles within the school grounds and store them on site in the covered bike shed at their own risk.

Breaktime

Breaktimes are currently staggered by year group to support with social distancing. Each year group has a 15 and 30-minute break per day. Students have access to our DINE facility and have the opportunity to expend energy on our basketball courts.

Breaktimes and lunchtimes are supervised by adults. There are plenty of people around.

Edulink One

The school utilises an app called EduLink One. This app has a variety of features including the ability to view information such as achievement points.

Curriculum

Our vision is to provide a curriculum which enables all learners to achieve their maximum potential and is relevant to life in modern society. It provides depth, breadth, challenge, enjoyment and progression at all levels; it promotes choice and allows specialisation; it enables learners to work towards fulfilling their aspirations.

Our motto is "Committed to Achievement" and this embodies our belief that <u>perseverance</u>, <u>self-discipline</u> and determination will enable all of our students to succeed at school and beyond.

We aim for the highest standards of educational achievement and value every student. We expect our students to fulfil their potential academically, personally and socially. To achieve this aim, we want each of our students to develop a sense of **PRIDE**.

All students receive the same curriculum with the only exception being that students study Spanish or French. The language a student studies is based on the tutor group students are allocated to, although students are asked for their preference prior to joining Cox Green. They will continue with the same language in Year 8 and 9.

F Food

We offer a café style service which provides a wide range of healthy, fresh food which is all prepared on site on the day it is sold at *Dine@Coxgreen*. There is always vegetarian choice available. An example of food and drinks on offer can be found on the website.

At the moment lunch is served at different times according to what year group you are in.

Cox Green School operate an online payment system called sQuid.

You will need a sQuid account to:

- Pay for any food or drink from our school cafeteria (there is a daily spend limit of £6)
- Pay for any trips or activities
- Pay for lockers
- Pay for revision books

You will receive details of your unique sQuid account number and registration instructions in June. Your child will then be registered on the system to enable them to use the cafeteria.

Free School Meals

We offer Free School Meals. Our website has an eligibility checker for Free School Meals.



Friends

Your primary schools will have told us who works well together and we use this information to help us put tutor groups together.

Remember you are not always taught in your tutor groups and lessons are about learning. Social times are break and lunch, when you are free to be with your friends.

In your tutor group you will do "getting to know you" activities. You will also do things in your House to help you. Getting involved in clubs and activities is another way of making new friends.



Homework

Homework enhances student learning, improves achievement and develops students' study skills and as such is an integral part of the curriculum.

In response to feedback from parents regarding homework we have developed and published a homework schedule that will help parents support their child in organising evenings and weekends. There may be times when homework is set on different days if groups/students are taught at different times, however, there will always be sufficient time to complete the work set.

House System

The House system allows every student to feel a sense of belonging by becoming a member of one of the Seven Houses (Brunel, Churchill, Hawking, Nightingale, Novello, Parks and Winton) Each were selected by our students and have a connection to the local area and/or link to our school ethos of **PRIDE**.

As house members all students have a range of opportunities to work together and 'compete' against other students, the other houses and even against themselves, earning house points in the process.

The house system is an integral part of our pastoral system and school culture, and develops a sense of pride and commitment.

The house system is designed to embody the school values and ethos -

Library

Our students have access to Cox Green Public library. Each student is issued with a library card. The library is available at breaktimes with access to the computers to support with homework learning.

Pastoral System

Each year group has a dedicated SAFE Manager. The SAFE Manager is there to support the behaviour and pastoral work of the students. Your child's SAFE Manager will stay with your child's year group throughout their time at school.

Students' wellbeing and inclusion is paramount to their education and we have access to a range of support agencies to help students. These include mentoring, The Hub, additional Literacy and Maths support, Education Welfare Officer, School Counsellor, career guidance, School Social Worker and an Educational Psychologist.

Remote learning

Remote learning is conducted via Microsoft Teams. The students follow their normal timetable. We support parent/carers who do not have access to a laptop and are continuously in touch with our parent/carers to ensure the welfare of your child whilst learning at home is monitored.

Teachers/Form Tutors

Your Form Tutor's role at Cox Green is central in both caring for you and, crucially, monitoring your progress both academically and socially; encouraging involvement, commitment, and high standards of work and behaviour. Your form tutor will offer support and guidance, and in doing so, help to alleviate any anxiety.

Your form tutor will help you grow a sense of independence, as you move through secondary school. This will take a number of forms, from helping you to find your way around a large school site in Year 7, getting you into the habit of having the right equipment and organising your planner, to picking your options in Year 9. When it comes to GCSEs, your form tutor will help you to plan your attendance at revision sessions, keep up to date with homework and coursework and manage the exam season.

Transition from Primary School

We have a fantastic transition programme, getting to know your child and their Year 6 teachers before you arrive. We have been commended for being the best school in the area with this. We have an Induction programme on site, meet the parents and carers evenings

Uniform

Alternatively, during term time, the school uniform shop is open on Wednesdays from 3.15pm to 4.15pm. The shop is located at the back of the school gymnasium and can be accessed via the side gate.
