With around 10 minutes to play, Piggott hit the right-hand post, but that was as close as they would come and Cox Green were able to celebrate winning the County Cup. A great season by all the players and (Coach) Mr Saunders said "A fully deserved County Cup win having been runners up for the past 2 seasons. They were a great group to work with and deserved their success over the whole season".
