



Please note the school will be closed from Monday 17th February to Friday 21st February. The school will re-open for all year groups on Monday 24th February.






Assemblies this week: Be Respectful **Holocaust Memorial** Day

This week, the assemblies were presented by Mr Furkins to commemorate the Holocaust Memorial Day on Monday 27th January. This year is particularly poignant, as 2025 marks 80 years since the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau. In the assembly, Mr Furkins shared with the students the life story and testimony of Susan Pollack MBE, who was sent to Auschwitz-Birkenau in 1944. Earlier this week, GCSE and A-Level History students visited Auschwitz and Krakow. Their trip included guided tours of Auschwitz and Birkenau, Schindler's Factory, the Wieliczka Salt Mines, Kazimierz (Jewish area) and Krakow old town.










#Literacy Matters

UKMT Maths Challenge Wednesday 29th January 2025



Selected students from Years 9, 10 and Year 11 were invited to take part in the UKMT Maths Challenge on Wednesday. This is a challenge which enables the students to use creative and out of the box approaches to solving mathematical problems. Every student that takes part will receive a certificate to showcase their score and by taking part, they have the opportunity to qualify for future rounds of the challenge. The certificate can be added to the students' CVs to evidence their problem solving abilities. The students were given one hour to attempt the paper which contained 25 multiple choice answers. In their Maths lessons in the run up to the challenge, the students were given the opportunity to try previous papers in order to prepare. We were delighted to see over 200 students take part this year and look forward to hosting future challenges. Well done to all the participants today!

Debating Club visit to Eton College


