
Dear Parents and Carers,



#### **Duke of Edinburgh Gold Training Day**

On Wednesday, the DofE Gold participants took part in their training day held onsite at the school to practise key skills necessary for their upcoming expedition. The students practised cooking outdoors, route planning, basic first aid and learnt how to assemble their tents quickly! The students also learned how to pack their bags efficiently, making the most of the limited space.

















### British Biology Olympiad 2025

From the 4th - 12th February, several of our students took part in the British Biology Olympiad (BBO), a competition designed for post-16 education. The competition consists of two, 45-minute multiple choice papers. Students were presented with topics and ideas which they are not familiar with and so competed with their problem solving skills and understanding of core principles. The BBO challenges and stimulates students with an interest in biology to expand and extend their talents, rewarding and encouraging students in their studies. 19 of our students took part and we were thrilled that several of our Year 11 students competed. Congratulations to Astri Leroy who was awarded silver, and Melody Atallah and Zoe Richard who were both awarded bronze. A huge well done to all participants from Year 11 and Year 12 for their hard work and achievements taking part: Lily Compton, Kuba Muszynski, Macey Florez, Summer Axten, Jessica Roberts, John Campling, Thomas Hancock, Gabriele D'Orizo, Charlotte Sloan, Mason Brown, Ted Mizova, Lucas Dolphin, Abbilee Chandler, Jessica Porter and Kavya Johri.

Congratulations to Yasmin Grant (Year 12) who achieved Gold, which makes her eligible to enter the selection process for the UK team who will later represent the country in the competition taking place in the Philippines during July. A student at Cox Green has never achieved this accolade before, which is even more impressive considering this was a competition aimed at Year 13 students. 18,533 students from 1053 schools participated this year which puts Yasmin in the top 5% of competitors. Well done!

#### **Eton Debating Club**

This week, Eton College debaters set the Cox Green students a task of debating in a futuristic and some might say dystopian society. The motion was "If the technology existed, This House, as a parent would use Archangel." Archangel would be a chip that was safely and painlessly implanted at birth and would allow parents to see a child's location at all times and allow parents to use their smartphones to put content restrictions on what the child could see. The parent could also monitor when a child's stress level went up and the chip would be automatically permanently disabled at sixteen. This motion was also debated at the finals of England's largest school debating competition. Our students who argued for proposition, cited safeguarding concerns that would be alleviated by the technology. Opposition argued the monitoring technology could undermine the parent- child relationship. The clarity and persuasiveness with which all debaters spoke was impressive, but ultimately proposition won on the day with their vision of a more protected environment for children thanks to the technology! An ethical motion that really engaged the students, it was excellent to see how well they all argued their respective positions.
