British Science Week





This week, Mr Shields presented an assembly for all year groups in recognition and celebration of British Science Week. This national event is a ten day celebration of science, technology, engineering and maths, which takes place from the 7th - 16th March! Mr Shields talked about the advances and advantages of technology - for example, the growth of renewable, sustainable energy resources. The students were invited to compare the different types of job roles that were in high demand in the 1980s compared with those that are now popular in the present day. The changes in the demand for the different type of jobs, from a video store worker in the 1980s to a robotics engineer in 2025, encouraged the students to reflect how the world we live in, changes and adapts.
