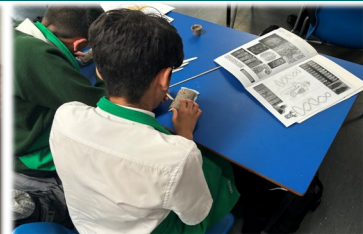
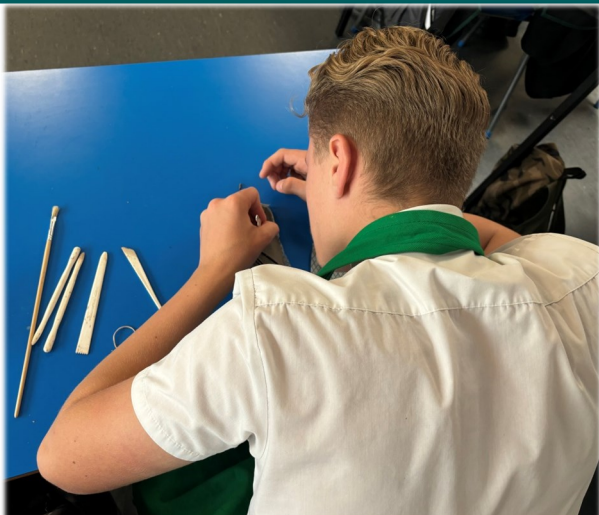

## Year 9 Art

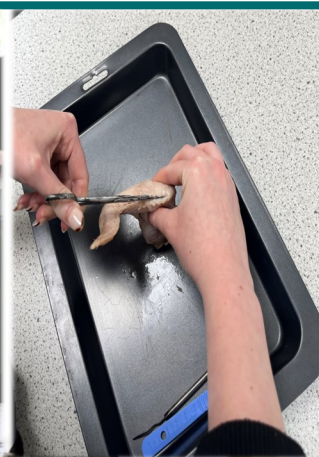
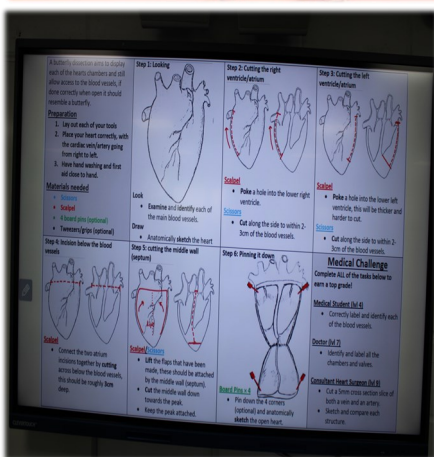

Mr Edwards would like to congratulate Elisha on her recent achievements at the European Youth Weightlifting Championships on Wednesday. This event was Elisha's first international for Great Britain.

Elisha competed in the 49kg body weight class and finished with 64kg. This was an incredible achievement, not only achieving her personal best, but setting a new British record. # KS3 Achievement Points



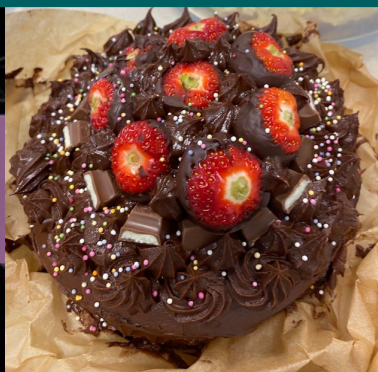

Well done to everyone involved!

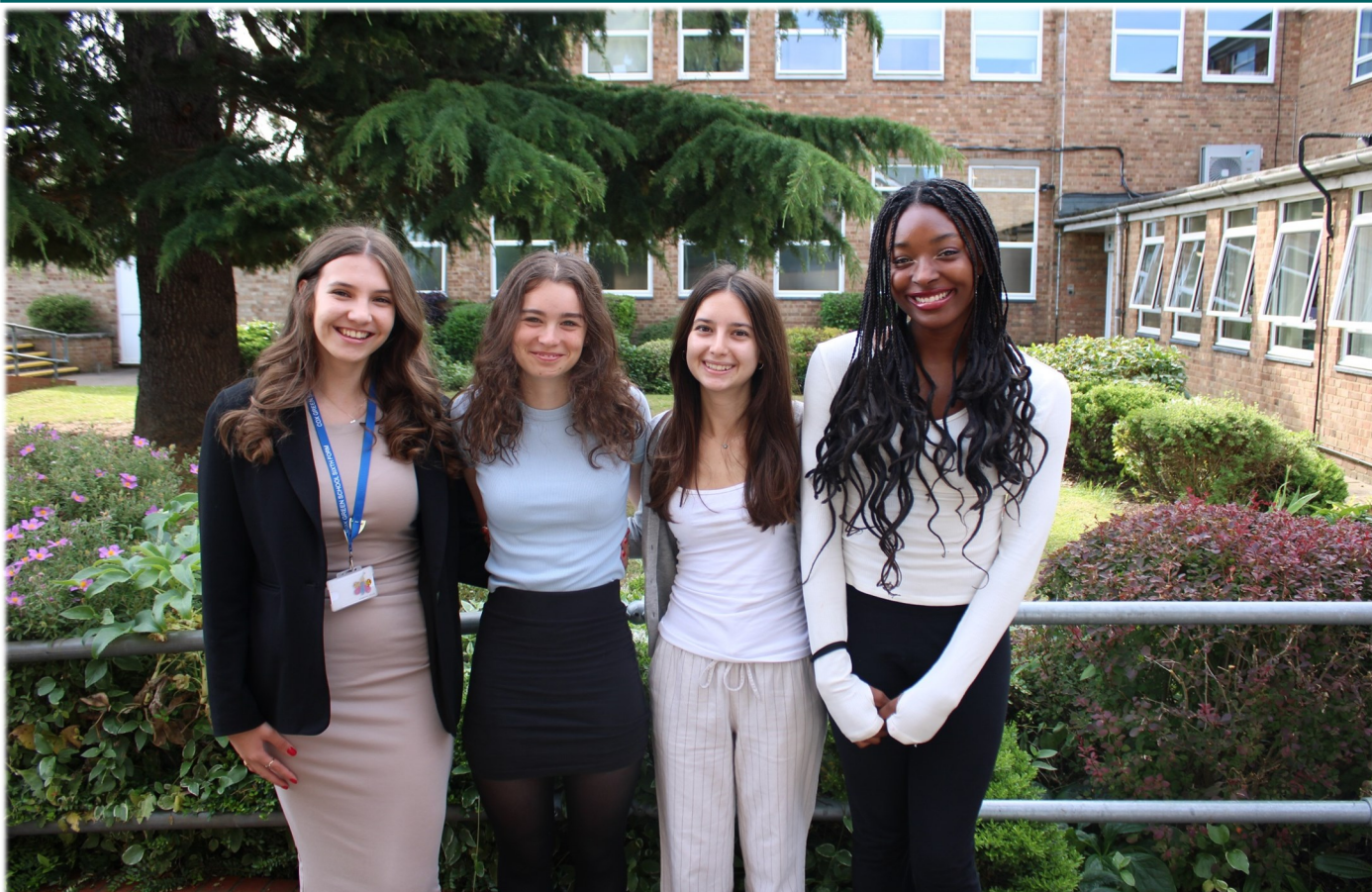


# Year 9 Cake Decorating

## Student News



We are delighted to announce that 4 of our Year 12 students, Amelia, Naomi, Diana and Alexea have completed their EPQ's! The Extended Project Qualification is an award undertaken by Year 12 students in order to prepare them for advanced undergraduate study. They are taught a variety of higher order study skills, such as sophisticated time management techniques, referencing skills, and critical source analysis before conducting their own inquiry into a topic of their choice. It takes around 90 hours of independent study and so completion is a massive achievement. The Students had to write a 5,000 word dissertation, complete a detailed log book and make a formal assessed presentation before they finally complete the project.

This year the subjects investigated included:

The impact of primary colours when used in interior design on human behaviour

The effect of sleep deprivation on teenage mental health

The use of Sportswashing in F1 and Road Cycling in Qatar and UEA

The impact of AI and digital technology on policing and crime solving

These students will receive their marks when they return from their summer break so they can be used to support their UCAS applications.
