






#### **House Points**

expression. We have enclosed some more suggestions for ways to support your child with developing their reading fluency:


#### **Buddy Reading**



#### Record it



#### **Preparing for Exams:**

Revision Strategies with Mr Hart and Sixth Form Reporters

With the exams coming up, Mr Hart shares some helpful revision tips with our Sixth Form Reporters:

#### Plan your revision

Consider making a revision timetable. By doing this, you are able to have flexibility to build in some relaxation time while still making time to study.

#### Creating posters with key information

These can be placed around your house to help revision feel more natural and less like a chore.

#### Teach friends and family

This is a fun way to revise by teaching your friends and family what you have learnt! This will encourage your brain to dig out information and through this, it allows you to prioritise any important topics that you struggle to remember.

#### **Record your notes**

Recording and then playing back your notes can drill in the information!

#### Researching past papers

The most crucial part of revision is knowing your exam paper inside out so there are no surprises! You can do this by researching your exam board specifications or by just practising past papers to familiarise yourself with the types of questions likely asked.

differences between anaerobic and aerobic exercise. They observed that even when they released the balloon, there was still air within it, showing in their demonstration why lungs do not collapse!


